## STEM Trip Visit to Williams Racing

A group of 10 KS3 girls recently took part in an inspiring STEM enrichment visit to Williams Racing, alongside 40 other students from across the city. The trip was led by Ms Hutchinson, whose work ensured the visit ran smoothly and successfully. The purpose of the trip was to promote participation in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics through real-world engineering applications.

The visit began with a hands-on STEM engineering challenge, where pupils were tasked with designing and constructing a nose cone for a Formula 1 car with the aim of creating the most effective crumple zone. This activity encouraged students to think critically about impact absorption, materials, and structural design.

Poppy emerged as the overall winner from all participating schools for this challenge. A second STEM activity followed, in which Chloe took first place, representing the group with outstanding performance.

Following the practical activities, students enjoyed a guided tour of the Williams Racing Museum, where they explored historic Formula 1 cars, technological advancements, and the team's achievements within the sport. The visit concluded with an exciting Formula 1 simulator experience, allowing students to apply their understanding of racing dynamics in a virtual environment.

Kiera achieved the fastest lap, with Willow securing second place, demonstrating excellent control, focus, and competitive drive.

The trip was a highly successful enrichment experience, providing pupils with valuable exposure to careers in engineering, motorsport, and applied science. It also served as a powerful opportunity to highlight female participation and achievement in STEM, with multiple students earning top placements across the day's challenges.
