Dear families,

We were delighted to welcome the Deputy Director of Education for Children, Families and Education to our school this week. During their morning visit, they toured both our primary and secondary phases, spending time in classrooms to observe teaching and learning and speaking with staff and students. We were extremely pleased that his feedback was highly complementary.

He shared: "Thank you so much for your time yesterday. I really enjoyed the visit and seeing the great work of you and your staff. It was clear that you have made significant progress, and the positive relationships between staff and children shone through."

This recognition reflects our shared ambition for continual improvement and the respectful, inclusive relationships that underpin our school community.

Our ongoing partnership with Rivers C of E Trust continues to strengthen teaching and learning in the primary phase. During the learning walk, strong practice was evident, including choral response, partnered talk and cold calling (no hands up), all of which support inclusive participation and high expectations for every child.

In secondary, students have attended assemblies focused on our literacy drive and the purpose behind it. Building on our work to develop confident oracy through the modes of learning, we are now moving into the next stage with Reading in Action. This will place a strong emphasis on reading aloud, reading routinely, thinking aloud and explicitly teaching vocabulary, reinforcing our commitment to ambitious learning for all.

I look forward to sharing further updates as this work continues to embed.

Holocaust Memorial Webcast 2026

Yesterday, to mark Holocaust Memorial Day (27 January), some of our pupils took part in the 2026 Holocaust Education Trust webcast featuring Holocaust survivor Paul Sved BEM. Paul shared a powerful first-hand account of his experiences during the Holocaust, alongside reflections from his son, Richard, on growing up as the child of a survivor and the importance of passing these stories on to future generations. The session deepened pupils' understanding of history, resilience, remembrance, and human rights. We are proud of the maturity and attentiveness shown by pupils throughout this meaningful learning experience.

Exploring Future Pathways Through Languages

Where can languages take you? A group of Year 9 and 10 pupils explored this question during an inspiring visit to the University of Portsmouth, discovering what it's really like to study languages at university. They experienced the university's state-of-the-art interpreting suite and heard first-hand stories from people who have lived and studied abroad. The visit gave our students plenty to think about as they consider their next steps.




THE SALTERNS TRUST INVITES YOU TO AN EVENING OF FOOD, CULTURE AND FRIENDSHIP
