We began our workshops by using a small, round robot called a Spherobot, controlled by a laptop. The staff and student helpers were very helpful. Then we walked to a different room, where we took part in a Lego bridge-building competition against two other schools. The winner was the team whose bridge held the most weight. After that, we built larger bridges using blocks of wood and tested whether they could hold our body weight.

Soon after, we were led to a chemistry room where we learned about different acids, bases, alkalis and their pH levels. After around 15–20 minutes, we walked over to the biology room and looked at different materials under a microscope. Then we






# Primary Christmas Present Buying Days
