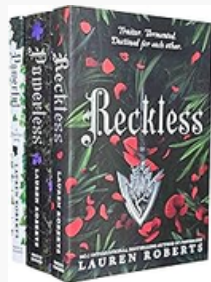

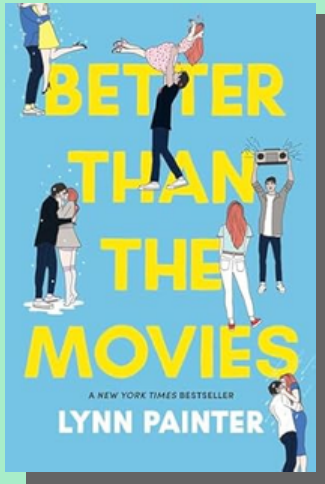

Her newest book, Sunrise on the Reaping is being released later on in the year and after, will be turned into a film, just like her other 4 very successful books.
