Mayfield KS4 Rugby Returns in Style After 10-year Hiatus

Mayfield School's KS4 rugby team made a triumphant return to competitive rugby this week, taking to the pitch for their first match in over ten years. Despite the narrow 10-5 defeat, it was a performance full of heart, physicality, and skill — laying a strong foundation for the season ahead.

Facing an opposition that had already played a match and boasted several club players, Mayfield rose to the challenge with a gritty and disciplined display. The game was fiercely contested from the outset, with both sides trading big hits and hard yards.

Ollie led the charge with relentless ball-carrying, constantly punching holes in the defensive line and putting Mayfield on the front foot. His power and determination were key in setting the physical tone of the game.

At scrum half, George managed the forwards with composure and intelligence, keeping the tempo high and ensuring structure around the breakdown. His calm leadership helped keep the pack focused in the heat of battle.

Defensively, Georgie and Leyton made their presence felt with a series of thunderous tackles, halting opposition momentum time and time again. Their physical commitment was matched by the elusive running of Mayfield's wingers, who consistently challenged the defence out wide with pace and agility.

Ralphy provided excellent control at full-back, reading the game well and providing a reliable last line of defence. His switch to scrum half later in the match was seamless, highlighting his versatility and game awareness.

The tight five came into their own when the scrums went fully contested, powering through their opposite numbers and giving Mayfield a solid platform. Their effort in the engine room laid the groundwork for the backs to operate. Captain Shaye Morrow led by example from fly-half, orchestrating attacks with smart kicking and sharp distribution. It was his vision and playmaking that created the opening for Mayfield's only try, finished brilliantly by the everdetermined Georgie.

With the scores level late into the second half, the match was ultimately decided by a last-minute try from the opposition — a cruel blow after such an even contest. Nonetheless, the boys left the field with heads held high. This performance marks an exciting new chapter for Mayfield rugby. The squad showed immense potential, and with the first match under their belts, there's every reason to believe this team will continue to grow in confidence and cohesion.

Get ready for the future you want.

It has been an exciting and productive half term for Careers Education at Mayfield!

We began by supporting our Year 11 students in exploring their next steps — from promoting local colleges and apprenticeship providers to guiding them through different application routes for September 2025.

A key highlight was our 2025 Careers Fair for Year 11s, where more than ten local providers joined us. Students had the opportunity to speak directly with representatives, ask questions, and gather valuable information about the courses and training options available to them.

So far, we've also held three assemblies focused on the application process — including when and how to apply. Most Year 11s have now had their one-to-one careers appointment with our adviser, who is helping them plan their next move. A reminder to all Year 11 students: start your applications now — don't wait until December!

Our Year 10 students have been equally busy securing their Work Experience placements, which must be confirmed by 19th December. To support this process, we held an online Work Experience parent information evening to explain how the system works and answer any questions from families.

During our recent Personal Development Day, the theme was Ambition. Year 7s reflected on where they see themselves in ten years' time, while Year 11s took part in a session with the University of Portsmouth, focusing on revision techniques and strategies for managing their upcoming GCSE exams.

What an amazing start to Year 1!

We are so proud of all the children and how brilliantly they have settled into their new routines. The move from Year R to Year 1 is a big step, but the children have taken it in their stride!

In Maths, we've been exploring numbers up to 100. The children have been counting in different ways and using a range of practical resources to support them. They have practised comparing numbers, partitioning into tens and ones, and using this knowledge to identify numbers on a number line.

In Reading, we've enjoyed reading a variety of books and have begun developing our predicting and inferring skills. Our new Drawing Club sessions have been a huge hit! The children love using their imaginations to invent their own settings, characters, and adventures. They draw their ideas and then write sentences about them, remembering to use capital letters, finger spaces, and full stops.

Phonics has been another area of fantastic progress this half-term. The children have revised everything they learned in Year R and have begun exploring new alternative sounds. Next half-term, we'll continue to expand this knowledge and start 'growing the code' and learning even more alternative sounds. We have sent home flashcards of tricky words to focus on over half term so please practice and quiz your children to help support their learning of these!

A big well done to everyone reading five times a week—your effort is really paying off! You've earned lots of stars, and we can't wait to see those bookmarks filled and prizes claimed!

Science has been full of discovery and excitement. We've been learning about seasonal changes and how each season brings

different weather, signs, and clothing choices. We've also been studying trees—learning to identify whether they are evergreen or deciduous, naming their different parts, and even going on a tree hunt around the school grounds to spot these features in real life!

In our wider curriculum, we've been finding out more about the country we live in. The children can now name the four countries that make up the UK, their capital cities, and have learned about the continents and oceans of the world. You might have heard the continents song being sung at home—it's definitely a class favourite!

In Art, we've been exploring how different lines and shapes can be used creatively. Inspired by music, we created expressive lines on paper and collaborated to produce a fantastic group artwork.

Our topic work has been full of excitement! We took part in a brilliant workshop where we discovered what life was like in London in 1666. The children had lots of fun dressing up as King Charles and even tried to put out the fire themselves! This hands-on experience really helped bring our history learning to life.

In DT, we have been learning all about healthy eating and where our fruit and vegetables come from. To finish off our topic, the children designed and made their very own fruit smoothies. They had a fantastic time chopping, blending, and of course—tasting!

In Music, we have been learning about the call and response method, focusing on animals you might see on a safari. The children worked incredibly hard to keep the rhythm and respond in time. We loved using the instruments and hearing the children's creative ideas—our classroom sounded like a real safari!

We are so proud of all the hard work, enthusiasm, and creativity the children have shown this half term. They truly deserve a well-earned rest over the holidays.

What an amazing start to Year 3 we have had in Amazon and Nile Class! The children have settled beautifully into their new routines and have shown real enthusiasm for learning. It has been wonderful to see how quickly they have adapted to life in Year 3—showing independence, curiosity and a fantastic attitude towards doing their very best.

This half term, our topic has taken us back in time as we explored life in the Stone Age. A definite highlight was our incredible trip to Butser Ancient Farm. The children loved stepping into the past—touring the roundhouses, learning about how our ancestors lived, carving chalk, making Stone Age bracelets, and even becoming archaeologists as they dug for ancient artefacts. It was a truly memorable day that brought our history learning to life!

In Art, we have continued our Stone Age theme by experimenting with natural materials to create beautiful pieces inspired by cave paintings. The children have enjoyed finding and using earthy tones and textures to produce some stunning artwork.

Our Science lessons have transformed us into budding geologists. We have been observing, testing and investigating different types of rocks and now understand how igneous, sedimentary and metamorphic rocks are formed. In English, we have been using this knowledge to write our very own non-chronological reports all about rock formation. You might like to ask your child about their favourite rock or what happens when a volcano erupts—after reading our class book, "Pebble in My Pocket," they truly are the experts! Next time you find a pebble on the beach, see if they can tell you about its long and fascinating journey through time.

In PE, we have been developing our skills in hockey, and the children have shown great

teamwork and perseverance. We are looking forward to welcoming Portsmouth Hockey Club for a workshop next half term.

It has been a wonderful start to the year, full of energy, enthusiasm, and great learning. We are so proud of all the children and can't wait for more adventures next half term.

What a busy and exciting half term it has been in Year 4! The children have shown fantastic enthusiasm and curiosity in everything they've done.

In Maths, we've been working hard on rounding and exploring 4-digit numbers. The class has also been developing efficient strategies for solving problems, including using the column method and bar models — it's been great to see their confidence grow!

In English, the children have produced some brilliant writing pieces. They created an informative online safety leaflet to help children stay safe on the internet, and also wrote a wonderful diary entry from the perspective of an Anglo-Saxon child — full of imagination and historical detail!

During our Reading lessons, we've enjoyed diving into The Queen's Nose and The Land of Roar, discussing characters, themes, and key events while practising our comprehension skills.

Our Science topic has been all about animals — we've learned to classify vertebrates and invertebrates, discovering the fascinating features that make each group unique.

In Design and Technology, the children have shown their creativity and teamwork by completing market research, designing, and making their very own biscuits for a target audience — the classroom smelled amazing during baking day!

In Music, we've been exploring rhythm and sound to represent the rainforest. The children used body percussion and glockenspiels to create layers of sound that captured the mood and atmosphere of the rainforest — a wonderfully creative and expressive experience!

In PE, we've been developing skills in basketball and gymnastics, focusing on teamwork, coordination, and control.

Finally, in History, we've travelled back in time to the Anglo-Saxon period, exploring why they came to Britain, what life was like, and how historians uncover these stories through artefacts and evidence.

A Fantastic First Half Term!

What an incredible start to the year it's been for Year 5! The children have worked so hard and shown great enthusiasm across all areas of learning this half term.

Our history topic on the Ancient Greeks has truly come to life. The children enjoyed an amazing Ancient Greek workshop, where they explored artefacts, tried out traditional games, and even experienced what life might have been like in Athens and Sparta. Inspired by our learning, we also delved into Greek myths, using the story of Theseus and the Minotaur as a model to plan and write our own exciting mythological adventures — full of heroes, beasts, and brilliant imagination!

In English, we have been gripped by Shackleton's Journey. The children wrote persuasive letters applying to join Ernest Shackleton's brave expedition to Antarctica, using powerful vocabulary and formal language to convince him they were the perfect explorers for the job. Their writing has been truly impressive!

In maths, we have been developing our understanding of decimals and money, learning how to convert between pounds and pence and solve real-life problems with confidence.

A real highlight of the half term was our 3D Art Showcase, where the children displayed their incredible creativity. The gallery was filled with colourful, detailed pieces that wowed everyone who came to see them.

We've also been proud to see some of our Year 5 pupils representing the school in football tournaments, showing excellent teamwork and determination.

It's been a busy and brilliant half term, and we couldn't be prouder of everything the children have achieved. We hope everyone enjoys a well-deserved rest over the break — we can't wait to see what the next half term brings!

Although we are already half a term into the school year, hard to believe, welcome to Year 6! The time has just flown by, and we have had an incredibly busy and successful start to the new school year. Our Year 6 children are taking their learning seriously, applying themselves and demonstrating our school values of Ambition, Inclusion and Respect in everything that they do.

In reading this half-term, we have been reading the book 'Rooftoppers' by Katherine Rundell, following on from our reading of Katherine Rundell's 'Explorers' in Year 5. Rooftoppers follows the young life of Sophie, believed to be orphaned as a baby when the ship that she was travelling on between France and England sank. Rescued by Charles, she is unconventionally raised and, in her teens, sets off with Charles to France, to escape being placed in an orphanage, and to find her mother, who she believes is still alive. Along the way, she meets Matteo and the theme of friendship blossoms. We have followed many key themes throughout the story including, determination, family, growing up and ingenuity.

In writing, we have covered two units so far. We have studied autobiographies and then written them about our lives to date, using features such as, first person pronouns, chronology, conjunctions, adverbs and prepositions, facts, opinions, relative clauses, and simple past and present progressive tenses.

For our second unit, we studied formal speeches and then wrote a formal speech about our new OPAL (Outdoor Play and Learning) initiative, applying the following skills, formal tone and register, modal verbs, formal tone, passive voice and viewpoints represented using conjunctions.

In maths, we have been learning about place value and reading and writing numbers up to and beyond a million. We have worked with various structures and representations to learn about patterns with numbers and expressions, including using adjusting, helping us to develop our mental calculation strategies and more efficient methods with addition and subtraction.

In Science, we have been learning about electrical circuits and power. We have been learning about power sources, making circuits, using switches, and how to make lights brighter and dimmer with scientific enquiry. We have been learning about voltage and current and where electricity comes from and what it is used to power.

In History, we have really enjoyed learning about World War II, including the impact it had on our country, local area and on our lives today. We have been leaning about enemies and allies during the war, as well as those in power for major countries involved and their roles. To support and enhance

this learning, we visited the D-Day Museum in Southsea and got to see many World War II artefacts to deepen our knowledge. Our Music this half term has been linked to World War II, focussing on music from throughout the war, and how it brought people together and motivated and comforted the nation. We focussed on the singer Vera Lynn and performed her iconic song 'We'll Meet Again'.

In PSHE, we have been learning all about our brains and about how different parts of our brains work in different situations. This helps us to understand why we behave and react to given situations and how we can develop strategies to help us and support our own mental health and well-being. We have also been learning about ourselves and how we form part of a team, working collaboratively together to problem solve and succeed. In French, we have been really fortunate to continue to receive specialist teaching from Madame Humphreys, learning about European countries.

Each Year 6 class also had the opportunity to care for our school chickens for a week, something that the children really enjoyed taking responsibility for. This is merely a snippet of what we have been up to in Year 6 but, as you can see, we have been busy. As always, thank you for your continued support, have a lovely half term break, and we look forward to the next half term and the run-up to Christmas.
