Meanwhile, our Year 11 students have made an excellent start to their GCSEs, beginning with their Spanish Speaking and Listening exams. Their focus and determination have been exceptional, and we are incredibly proud of the maturity and ambition they continue to display as they enter this crucial period. Equally

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impressive has been the ambition shown by our Year 6 pupils during their Key Stage 2 SATs. Their commitment, perseverance and calm approach to the exams reflect their hard work and the support of both staff and families.

Our younger students have also been making the most of every opportunity to learn and grow. Year 2 were especially excited about their recent trip to the farm, which provided valuable handson learning in a new and engaging environment. They returned full of stories and questions—an inspiring reminder of how inclusion and curiosity go hand in hand.

Another major highlight this term was the unforgettable Year 7 residential to Tile Barn. Blessed with glorious weather, our students tackled a packed itinerary—from team-building challenges to swimming in the Lymington Salt Baths. Throughout the trip, they embodied our values brilliantly, especially in the way they supported one another. A huge thank you to Mrs Reid for leading the organisation of the camp, and to all staff who gave their time to ensure it was such a positive and rewarding experience.

We also welcomed an external review of our SEND provision across both primary and secondary phases, led by Mr David Bartram. The review involved staff and student interviews, learning walks, and an evaluation of outcomes. The initial feedback—and now the final report—recognise the significant strides we have made. Our SEND leadership was described as strategic and responsive, with a strong culture of care and high expectations. While we are proud of this progress, we remain committed to ensuring that all teaching is consistently adaptive and of the highest quality.

This half term has also been a period of growth for our staff team. We've hosted a number of visiting teachers for interviews as we expand our KS4 option choices to meet growing interest. The feedback from candidates has been overwhelmingly positive, especially regarding the warmth of our school environment and how clearly our values are reflected in the everyday conduct of our students. It is a real point of pride that visitors so often comment on the inclusive and respectful atmosphere we work hard to cultivate.

This week, we also held our Primary Parents and Carers Evening—an excellent opportunity to celebrate the progress and achievements of our younger pupils. It was wonderful to see so many families engaged in meaningful conversations about learning, growth and next steps. Thank you to all who attended and continue to support our children on their educational journey.

Looking ahead to the second half of the summer term, we have much to be excited about. We'll be hosting our annual Presentation Evening, where we celebrate the many accomplishments of students across the school. Our Year 10 students are preparing for work experience placements, gaining valuable insights into the world of work. And we will continue to welcome new pupils through our transition events, ensuring that every child feels included, supported and valued from their very first day.

It has been a truly outstanding half term. I am continually inspired by the efforts, attitudes, and achievements of our pupils and by the commitment of our staff and families who work so hard to support them.



Animal Adventures – A Half Term Full of Discovery!

This half term has been a whirlwind of excitement and hands-on learning as we explored our new topic: Animals. With bank holidays, school visits, and some very special visitors, the past few weeks have been packed with memorable experiences that brought our curriculum to life.

The children began by discovering a wide variety of animals, from those found in the wild to those we might see at home or on the farm. They have been introduced to early classification skills, learning how to group animals based on features such as where they live, what they eat, and whether they have fur, feathers, or scales. It has been wonderful to see the children so engaged and full of curiosity, asking thoughtful questions and making fascinating observations.

One of the highlights of the term was observing the incredible transformation of caterpillars into butterflies. The children carefully watched each stage of the life cycle, from tiny wriggling caterpillars to chrysalises and finally to beautiful butterflies which we released into the wild. This real-life experience helped the children develop a deeper understanding of nature and change.

Another special moment came when we welcomed more eggs into the classroom. Over the course of a few days, the children eagerly monitored the incubator and their patience was rewarded when fluffy chicks began to hatch.

To celebrate everything we've learned, we ended the half term with a fantastic trip to the farm. It was a day full of adventure! The children had the chance to feed baby animals, cuddle some of the smaller ones, and even

take part in farm chores like collecting eggs. It was a fantastic opportunity to reinforce all their learning in a real-world setting and to connect with nature in a hands-on way.

This topic has sparked so much enthusiasm, and we're incredibly proud of how engaged and curious the children have been throughout. Their questions, discussions, and discoveries have made this a truly lovely half term.

Thank you, as always, for your continued support at home. We hope you enjoy talking with your children about all they've experienced and maybe even spotting a few animals together over the break!

The children have been working incredibly hard this half-term, and with the sun starting to shine, we've been enjoying finding creative ways to take our learning outside and make the most of the few days of beautiful weather we have been given! Here are some of the highlights of our learning this half term...

We started the term by reading the book, 'There's a Rang-Tan in my Bedroom' which sparked some great conversations about rainforests and how we can look after our planet. Using this new knowledge of the rainforest, the children then developed their writing skills by creating a setting description of a rainforest. They also enjoyed reading 'And Tango Makes Three', a lovely story that celebrates family and belonging.

This half-term in Phonics, similarly to Spring 2, we've been spending more time preparing the children for the phonics screening in June. We've had plenty of recap sessions to make sure they're re-learning everything we've covered so far. A big well done to all the children who are reading five times a week – they're making fantastic progress with their phonics – keep up the great work!

This term in maths, the children have been getting to grips with the numbers 11 to 19 and really starting to understand what those numbers mean. A big focus of our learning in Maths recently has been our number bonds to 10, we are now becoming more confident on these and we are starting to use these to help work out our number bonds to 20! If you get a chance to quiz your child on their number bonds to 10, this will help their automatic recall and aid their learning. We spent some time exploring measurement this term, looking at centimeters, rulers and measuring objects in and out of the classroom! It's been wonderful to see how enthusiastic they've been about their learning and how much fun they've had along the way!

We hope you are all well! It's been a busy and exciting term in Year 2, and we wanted to share with you some of the wonderful learning experiences we've had recently. From writing creative pieces to exploring new areas of maths and science, here's a glimpse into what your child has been up to.

This term, our Year 2 pupils have been learning about plants and their fascinating characteristics. They have worked hard to write non-chronological reports about plants, detailing the different parts of plants. The children have enjoyed researching and presenting information in an informative yet engaging way.

In Maths, we've been learning all about division. The children have explored dividing numbers into equal groups and solving division problems through practical activities. We've used objects and visual aids to help reinforce their understanding of sharing and grouping. Ask your child to show you some division examples they've worked on!

In Reading, we've been learning about influential women of history, and this topic has tied in beautifully with our history curriculum. The children have read stories about women who made significant contributions to society, such as Marie Curie and Florence Nightingale. This topic has sparked some great discussions about perseverance, bravery, and the power of making a difference.

This term in Design and Technology, the children had lots of fun designing and making their own vehicles using wheels and axles. They carefully planned their designs, chose materials, and learned how axles help the wheels to turn smoothly. The children enjoyed testing their finished vehicles and were proud to see them move across the classroom!

We have loved transforming our Year 2 garden area with many beautiful plants and flowers, the children enjoy watering them daily and making sure they get the nutrients that they need to thrive. Please take a look if you can, I'm sure you will love it just as much as we do!

As we reach the end of the Summer 1 half term, we wanted to share some of the fantastic learning and experiences your children have had over the past few weeks.

It was lovely to meet with you all during our parent evenings. We really value these conversations and your continued support — it makes a huge difference in your child's learning journey.

We ended last term with an amazing trip to Fishbourne Roman Palace. The children thoroughly enjoyed all the activities during the morning workshop — from creating mosaics and writing Roman letters to bridge building, wool spinning, and exploring the Roman kitchen. In the afternoon, they were fascinated by the intricate Roman mosaic floors and had a wonderful time playing and discovering new things in the beautiful gardens. It was a truly memorable day!

This term in Science, we've been exploring the rainforests – often referred to as 'the lungs of the planet'. We've discussed their vital role in tackling climate change and supporting biodiversity. The children were really moved by the impact of deforestation and habitat destruction. We looked closely at the endangered species list and focused on the plight of orangutans, which sparked some powerful discussions.

We then brought the issue closer to home and began exploring rewilding and ways to encourage nature back into our own school grounds — an inspiring shift from global to local action.

We began the term by writing narrative stories based on a predator/prey scenario, which the children then transformed into comic strips — a creative and engaging way to bring their writing to life!

Building on our Science topic, we're now tackling persuasive writing by composing letters to the council — objecting to a rather outrageous suggestion to turn our field into a car park! Yes, we're actually teaching your children to complain (politely and formally, of course!).

In Maths, we've been consolidating our understanding of the column subtraction method and have just started to dive into fractions. The children are showing great progress and resilience in tackling these new concepts.

In RE, this week we are beginning to compare rituals across different religions, considering how shared values are expressed in unique and meaningful ways.

This half-term has been a busy and exciting one for Year 4, packed with hands-on learning, creative writing, and new experiences both in and out of the classroom.

In Science, the children have been exploring the fascinating properties of different states of matter. A standout moment was when they combined vinegar and bicarbonate of soda to create a gas, which inflated a rubber glove! This fun and fizzy experiment helped bring their understanding of solids, liquids, and gases to life.

In English, pupils have been letting their imaginations run wild, writing wonderful poems all about the weather. Their work has shown great creativity, powerful vocabulary, and a growing confidence in using poetic techniques. Meanwhile, in Reading, Year 4 have been gripped by the thrilling adventures of Varjak Paw, discussing themes of bravery, independence, and identity as they follow the young cat's journey.

Away from the classroom, Year 4 have recently begun their swimming lessons at the Mountbatten Centre. With just two lessons under their belts so far, we're really looking forward to watching their confidence grow and celebrating their progress in the weeks to come. We also celebrated VE Day in style by creating colourful bunting to decorate their classroom and outdoor area. The children enjoyed a lively street party, complete with music from the 1940s and plenty of joyful dancing. It was a fun and memorable way to honour history while coming together as a year group.

Looking ahead, there's even more to be excited about as Year 4 prepare for their upcoming trip to the Winchester Science Museum. It's sure to be a fantastic way to build on their science learning and spark even more curiosity.

This half term has flown by, especially with the bank holidays and the fewer weeks in this part of the summer term. Despite the shorter time, we've dived into some fantastic learning experiences. Here's a brief look at what we've been up to in Year 5.

In reading, we have been focusing on the narrative, 'The Explorer' by Katherine Rundell. This story follows four children whose plane crashes in the Amazon Rainforest, leaving them on a journey of survival, exploration and friendship. In our reading we have really focused on our opinions and viewpoints of each character and their traits, and how these change as the story develops.

In writing, we began the half term by exploring the language and key features of playscripts. We focused on elements such as stage directions, formal and informal language, colons, scenes, brackets, and italics. The unit culminated in us writing our own playscripts, incorporating all these features, and then bringing them to life through performance.

Following this, we shifted our focus to narrative writing, where we built on our existing knowledge to further develop character traits and description. We used dialogue, narration, and action to enhance our storytelling and move the plot forward. This work also provided a great opportunity to make meaningful connections with our reading.

In maths, we started the half term by revisiting and building upon our knowledge of multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000, really focusing on our use of place value and relationships between numbers. We then moved on to learning about

the volume of compound shapes and comparing volume with mass, before then moving on to prime and square numbers. As we neared the end of the half term, we concluded our learning by exploring the commutative and associative laws of multiplication.

In Science, we've been exploring animals and their habitats. The children have shown great enthusiasm in learning about the various animal groups and their characteristics, as well as how to classify them. We've studied the life cycles of different animal groups and examined a range of habitats—from the icy conditions of the Antarctic to the scorching heat of the desert—focusing on how animals adapt to survive in these environments. Additionally, we've investigated the impact of human activity and climate change on these habitats, and how such changes affect the survival of different animal species.

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In PSHE, we have been learning about 'Being our Best' and growing our independence, how we keep ourselves safe, the responsibilities of ourselves and others in keeping both mentally and physically healthy, and how we can work to get good, positive balances in life. A great way to achieve this has been through our PE lessons! We have been focusing on dance moves with a 'spooky' theme and, of course, there is no better song and dance to have chosen than the late Michael Jackson's Thriller! We have had a lot of fun learning and performing it. In History, we have continued with our comparative studies of the Mayans and Anglo-Saxons. To support and enhance this, we visited the 878AD Anglo-Saxon immersive experience in Winchester, along with the Winchester Museum to study artefacts. We also had a Mayan workshop at school, which was full of drama and role play.

Some of us also had the opportunity to work with a specialist teacher from Portsmouth's Music Hub, writing and performing a rap, before then shooting a music video with special effects! As always, thank you for your continued support of our learning in Year 5, which is very much appreciated. Have a lovely bank holiday weekend and half term!
