Dear Parents and Carers,

This final half term has been packed full of amazing opportunities and activities. It has also been an incredibly full and rewarding academic year. As we move toward the summer break, the energy and achievements of our students continue to be nothing short of inspiring. The past few weeks have been packed with a diverse range of experiences that truly reflect the ambition, inclusion, and respect at the heart of our school community.

We began this half-term by launching our Year 10 work experience programme—an exciting opportunity for students to gain real-world insight, develop their skills, and explore potential career paths. Feedback from employers were overwhelmingly positive, with many praising the maturity, enthusiasm, and professionalism of our students. Alongside this, Year 10 also completed their mock exams with great focus, showing real commitment as they prepare for the year ahead. I have attached a summary of the full report. The review team recognised the rapid progress the school has made, highlighting the clarity of leadership and the clear sense of purpose

guiding our improvement journey. It was an important and affirming moment for our whole school community.

At the same time, we've been supporting our Year 11 students as they completed their GCSE exams. Their approach throughout was remarkable—they showed real resilience. maturity, and focus. We were proud to celebrate their journey in our Leavers' Assembly, where we reflected on their growth and wished them every success for the future. They have embodied our values in everything they've done, and we know they will continue to do so in the next chapter of their lives. Their achievements extended beyond the classroom too, with the Year 11 football team securing a fantastic win in the Portsmouth Cup Final-showcasing sportsmanship and teamwork at its finest.

This sense of celebration extended across the school. Our Performing Arts Showcase was a vibrant evening of dance, music, and creativity, with students from every year group sharing their talents on stage. The atmosphere was electric, and the confidence and joy on display were a true credit to them all. Thank you to everyone who made the event such a success, especially Ricardo in Year 11, who co-hosted the evening with me brilliantly.

It was also a joy to host our Presentation Evening, where we recognised the academic progress, positive attitudes, and achievements of students across all year groups. Moments like these remind us of the strength of our school community and the bright futures

ahead for our young people. Recognition of dedication continued beyond our own walls, as we celebrated alongside colleagues at the Teach Portsmouth Awards. It was an inspiring evening that honoured the commitment of educators across the city. We were proud to see Jan Andrews shortlisted for the Volunteer Award, and to see Mrs Sinclair, Mrs Rogers, and Mrs Abbott receive Long Service Awards—an acknowledgment of their exceptional service to education and our school.

In Primary, the enthusiasm and engagement of our pupils have been equally impressive. Our Primary Sports Day was a brilliant occasion, filled with teamwork, effort, and healthy competition. Children across all year groups gave it their all, and the support they showed one another was special to see. We are extremely proud of what they have achieved with this programme; some of them even got offered part-time jobs, apprenticeships and summer jobs. This was a very successful experience for our pupils; well done Year 10!

Later in the term, our Year 10s visited two local colleges, and they had the experience of going to college for a day, getting taster sessions of the subjects they know and love the most, along with getting involved in a variety of activities just like college students. They chose from A-levels, T-Levels, vocational courses and apprenticeships. Our curriculum has truly come to life this year, with pupils enjoying a wide range of trips, workshops, and unforgettable experiences that have deepened their understanding of their year group topics.

Year R pupils visited Longdown Dairy Farm, where they were able to connect their classroom learning to real-world experiences with animals and farming life.

We have had a super busy final halfterm in Year 1, full of learning and growing. Here are a few of our highlights!

InReading, we focused on two brilliant books: The Lion Inside and The Proudest Blue. The children loved diving into these stories, exploring the characters and themes, and sharing their thoughtful responses. It was a joy to see how much confidence they gained in expressing their ideas and how engaged they were throughout.

This half-term, the children thoroughly enjoyed our Geography topic, which was all about maps and fieldwork. They took part in some exciting fieldwork, using maps to follow simple directions around the school grounds. They especially loved creating their own maps! It was fantastic to see their enthusiasm and growing confidence as young geographers.

The children built on the athletic skills they had developed previously and had a brilliant time applying them in both indoor and outdoor PE sessions. Indoors, they practised simple techniques for attacking and defending, showing great teamwork and determination. Outdoors, the focus was on sending and receiving equipment safely. All of this practice helped them feel well-prepared and confident for Sports Day!

In RE, the children explored the theme of Remembering. They reflected thoughtfully on who and what they like to remember, sharing some lovely and personal ideas during class discussions. We then learned about how Hindus remember Krishna, and the children showed great

curiosity and respect while discovering more about Hindu beliefs and traditions.

In Maths, the children continued to develop their understanding of money by recognising the 1p, 2p, 5p, and 10p coins and understanding their values. They impressed us with how quickly they could identify the coins, and we loved using this knowledge in a whole-class game of 'shops'!

In Computing, the children had great fun exploring programming through Scratch Jr. They learned how to give commands to a sprite and were thrilled to see their characters move across the screen in response. It was wonderful to watch their confidence grow as they experimented with sequencing instructions and creating simple animations. The children were fully engaged and loved bringing their ideas to life through coding!

This half-term in Science, our topic was Plants, and the children were absolutely fascinated! They CONT...



explored the basic structure of plants and confidently named key features such as roots, stems, leaves, and flowers. We investigated a variety of common wild and garden plants, including both deciduous and evergreen trees.

The children loved getting hands-on with their learning—performing simple tests, identifying different plants, and planting and looking after their own! A highlight of the topic was our exciting trip to Harold Hillier Gardens, where the children had a fantastic time exploring the grounds and deepening their understanding in a beautiful, real-life setting.





In Art, the children explored painting with a focus on primary colours. They learned to identify red, blue, and yellow and had a brilliant time experimenting with colour mixing to create secondary colours. A highlight was our fun Art Day, where the children used their new skills to create artwork inspired by different artists. Their creativity really shone through, and it was fantastic to see them so engaged and proud of their colourful masterpieces!

What an incredible year it's been in Year 1! The children have grown in confidence, curiosity, and independence. We are so proud of all they've achieved and how ready they are for Year 2.

What an Incredible Year in Year 2!

As the summer holidays approach, we are feeling a mix of emotions – excitement for the summer break, but also a little sad to say goodbye to our lovely Year 2 class. It has been such an amazing year, filled with growth, creativity, and so much joy. We are so proud of every one of our students, who have shown kindness, enthusiasm, and a passion for learning every day.

Here's a glimpse into all the fantastic learning we've done this year:

In reading, we've had a brilliant time exploring Fantastic Mr Fox by Roald Dahl. We wrote character descriptions and thought carefully about the personalities of Mr Fox and the other characters. We also read The Enormous Crocodile by Dahl, which had us all laughing and discussing the importance of making good choices. We've worked hard on building our reading skills, making predictions, and exploring characters' feelings.

In writing, we've developed our skills in creating descriptive writing, especially when writing about characters from the books we've read. We focused on using adjectives to describe characters and setting, and it was so fun to see how the children used their imaginations to bring the characters to life!

In maths, we've focused on time, position, and direction this term. We learned how to tell the time to the nearest five minutes, use directional language, and even worked with simple maps and coordinates. The children have shown such enthusiasm, and it's been wonderful to see them applying their knowledge in real-life situations.

In science, we continued to explore plants and what they need to grow. Every child



planted their own sunflower, and it has been so exciting to watch their plants grow! We also spent time learning about the life cycle of plants and how important it is to care for them properly.

In Geography, we took a deep dive into the Yanomami tribe and the Amazon Rainforest. The children were fascinated by the rainforest's ecosystems and the importance of protecting such an incredible part of our world. We also learned about deforestation and discussed how we can all help take care of our planet.

One of the special events this year was our Year 2 Production – what an incredible performance it was! We are so proud of every child who worked hard and performed with such confidence. It was truly a special moment for all of us. We also had an unforgettable trip to the Titanic Museum, where the children learned about history in such an engaging and hands-on way.

Through it all, we've seen such growth in our students, both academically and personally. Our Year 2 class is full of kindness, happiness, and love, and we couldn't be more grateful for every moment we've shared together.

A huge thank you to all of our parents for your continuous support this year. Whether it was helping with homework or simply encouraging your child's learning journey, we truly appreciate everything you've done. This has been an incredibly positive and rewarding year, and we couldn't have done it without you.

As we say goodbye to Year 2, we want to thank you for allowing us the privilege of teaching such a wonderful group of children. We will miss them, but we are excited for what's ahead in Year 3.

As we come to the end of Summer Term 2 and begin our final half term in Year 3 it's a wonderful opportunity to reflect on everything the children have achieved this year. It has been a term full of creativity hard work and plenty of fun along the way. There is so much to celebrate as we look back on the exciting things we've been learning across all subjects.

In English we began the half term by travelling back in time to ancient Pompeii. The children were given the challenge of writing historical stories using dialogue to bring their characters to life. These stories followed two people who had to escape together as Mount Vesuvius erupted. The children worked hard to build suspense and use speech in a way that helped tell the story clearly. The imagination and emotion in their writing really shone through and they did a brilliant job of capturing such a dramatic event. To end the term we took a more cheerful turn into the colourful world of Mr Men. Each child created a character based on their own personality and redesigned it in their own artistic style. From there they planned and wrote their very own Mr Men stories which were full of humour creativity and charm. We were so impressed with the effort that went into every stage of the process.

In maths we have been exploring a unit on fractions. The children learned how to find fractions of amounts and then built on this by adding and subtracting fractions. We spent time solving real life problems and looking at how fractions can be used in everyday situations. More recently we have moved on to telling the time. We have looked at using both analogue and digital clocks and understanding minutes past and to the hour. This has been a really practical unit and we hope the children feel more confident using their new skills at home. So next time they ask how long until dinner feel free to let them figure it out for themselves.

In science our focus has been light. The children learned that light travels in straight lines and that it is reflected from surfaces. We explored how we are able to see objects when light enters our eyes and why shadows are formed when something blocks the light. The class carried out investigations using mirrors and torches to see how light behaves in different conditions. They asked thoughtful questions tested their ideas and shared some brilliant observations during discussions.

As we head towards the end of the year we are excited about the celebrations to come. We will be taking a trip to College Park where we will take part in nature based activities explore the outdoors and enjoy some well deserved time to play and relax with our friends. It's a lovely way to mark the end of a fantastic year together.

We are incredibly proud of the effort progress and enthusiasm shown by every child in Year 3. It has been a joy to watch them grow in confidence build new friendships and challenge themselves in so many ways. They should feel really proud of what they have achieved. We wish them all the very best of luck as they move up into Year 4 and we hope they enjoy a fun happy and restful summer holiday.

What a busy and exciting half term it's been in Year 4! We're delighted to share some of the fantastic learning and experiences your children have taken part in over the past few weeks.

In Science, we've been exploring the topic of sound. The children have loved investigating how sound is made and how it travels. Through a series of hands-on experiments, they tested how vibrations work and explored how different materials can affect the volume and pitch of sound. It's been wonderful to see their curiosity and enthusiasm as they discovered more about the world around them.

In Geography, we've been learning about environmental regions and how weather and climate influence the way people live their lives. From the icy Arctic to tropical rainforests, the children explored how homes, clothing, and daily activities vary across different parts of the world. They particularly enjoyed comparing their own lives to those of children in other regions.

Physical Education has been full of energy this term! We've continued our swimming lessons, with many children growing in confidence and improving their technique. In addition, we've been learning the rules and skills needed to play rounders, even participating in some exciting class competitions. Great teamwork and sportsmanship were on display from all!

We were pleased to hold two successful transition days to help the children prepare for Year 5. These sessions gave them a chance to meet new teachers, explore their new classroom, and take part in fun

activities designed to build excitement and ease any worries about the move up next year.

Thank you for your continued support – we're so proud of all that Year 4 have achieved this term and look forward to what the rest of the year brings.

We cannot believe that the school year has come to an end and that we have reached the summer holidays. Whilst we are delighted for everyone to get to enjoy the long summer break, and hopefully good summer weather, the end of year is always tinged with a mix of emotions. We have had an incredible year with our Year 5 children, created so many opportunities, experiences and memories, and we are incredibly proud of them. They have been an absolute privilege to teach.

Here is a snippet of all of the amazing learning that we have doing in Year 5 this last half term. In reading, we finished the journey of 'The Explorer' - Katherine Rundall, following of a group of children lost in the Amazon jungle, following a plane crash. We got to know the characters and empathised with them on their journey of survival. We studied the text for character traits and behaviours and used evidence to demonstrate how our views of each character changed over time. We then went on to read 'Five Children and IT' - E. Nesbit, following the lives of five siblings who have moved to the countryside from inner city London, and waste no time in exploring their new and vast surroundings. Stumbling across an ancient and magical 'Sand Fairy', they have a wish granted for theme each day, but not without consequences! This story allowed us to apply all of our reading skills around the theme of dilemmas, decision making and consequences.

In writing, we have written biographies about Sir Isaac Newton, using links to our science topic this half term. We used features such as; chronological order, formal standard English, perfect present and past tenses. We also learnt a lot about

what an influential scientist, inventor and engineer Sir Isaac Newton was. We finished the school year polishing up on our use of grammar and punctuation in readiness for Year 6.

In maths, we have had a real focus on fractions and multiplication this half term. We have been learning about unit fractions, non-unit fractions, proper and improper fractions and mixed number fractions. We have worked with both expressions and representations within our work. In science, we have been learning about forces and friction. We have carried out plenty of investigative science, based on floating and sinking and surface friction. We have made predictions and measured in newtons with push and pull forces, then evaluating our scientific thinking and methods.




In building up to our fieldwork school visit to Queen Elizabeth Country Park, we learnt all about map reading, landmarks and grid references in Geography, using both four figure and six figure grid references. We also learnt how use and read compasses. We loved our visit to apply and consolidate this learning whilst having some end of year fun. The children have really enjoyed learning about musical theatre in our music topic this half term. We all loved watching some of the old classics like; 'Mary Poppins' and 'Annie', comparing them with the re-booted versions. In PE, we spent our learning time developing our athletics skills, all in preparation for our recent Sports Day, which we really enjoyed taking part in. Our artwork has been focussed around producing art through different mediums.

All in all, we have done so much, not just this half term, but this whole academic year. We thank you wholeheartedly for your parental support this year, which has just contributed so much to the learning, and we wish our amazing children all the best for Year 6!
